The **BMC safety course** is run annually in Wales and covers topics relating to the safe and proper management of University Clubs, both on and off the mountains and crags. Since not all the costs relate directly to training, part of the overall expenditure is met by the normal club account and part by the fund account.

The **Rescue Emergency Care** course covers emergency first aid for outdoor enthusiasts and is the standard required for professional certification in many instruction courses. The emphasis is on practical care and evacuation of injured parties.

The **Site Specific** course covers the requirements to become an instructor at the UCD Climbing Wall.

The **Mountain Skills** course cover navigation topics such as compass work, map reading and feature recognition and night navigation. The fund contribution was particularly low because a low cost was negotiated with the course provider.

A surplus remains in the account at the end of the year. It was anticipated that a Single Pitch Award assessment would be taken by two club members but this will not happen until the next academic year. A separate back account was created late this year to facilitate the continued existence of the Training Fund and all transactions will be through this account in the future. The current bank account balance and the balance stated here may be different because of the late institution of the account. The bank account balance should be adjusted with club funds to reflect the figures here.

Training in the next year will be managed by the Training and Development Officer (a newly created position) in conjunction with the Club Captain.

UCD Mountaineering Club would like to acknowledge the O'Keeffe family's continued participation in the club and their generous support for the provision of professional training to club members.
